With a mission to build bridges between the Nordic region and the international film community, NIFF will go further than your average film festival, encouraging and connecting filmmakers from all over the world.

There is no other opportunity as a Nordic filmmaker to be seen the way you'll be seen at NIFF. We take our mission seriously, and care for the opportunity to showcase the talent that Nordic actors, directors, producers, screenwriters, and filmmakers hold; and we want to make a difference introducing them to the international film market and have successfully done so since our beginning 2015. Our long-term goal is to become a Nordic Film Market, or rather the Nordic Market in North America – to encourage filming in the Nordic region and create a platform for Nordic filmmakers to sell and show their films in New York and in the US.

NIFF is in the forefront of the battle for an inclusive film market, proudly following the lead of the Nordic countries – all topping the world's equality tests. By constantly staying aware of political evolution, both the Bechdel test and the Vito Russo test are taken into consideration when the official selection is made by our programmers.

We wouldn't exist without our filmmakers, and we take care of them by introducing them to distribution companies and journalists. NIFF's programmers focus on finding diverse independent films with strong characters and storylines and encourage all filmmakers to submit their films, regardless of ethnicity, religion or worldview. One part of our program highlights Nordic classic themes found in classic Nordic productions.

Our six categories include Nordic and international films, all in competition, and often followed by interesting and informative Q&A's with the filmmakers. We make sure to highlight how it is to film in the Nordic region and how funding works to come to Scandinavia to shoot your film, both through our panels, and our well-educated staff. We hold panels and seminars at NIFF, and we end each festival with a red carpet reception for press, filmmakers and general audience, Lastly is our awards ceremony where we announce our international jury's decisions.

Chasing 50 50

Women's empowerment is taking center stage at this year's Nordic International Film Festival (NIFF) as the Nordic value of gender equality meets the cinematic artistry of Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Finland and Iceland at the Festival's 2018 edition.

Official selection criteria for the Festival resulted in 87.5 percent of films featured having at least one woman in a power position such as director, writer, producer or executive producer. At the same time, representation of female directors among the NIFF selection is 667 percent higher than among the 250 top grossing Hollywood films in 2016. The number for female writers, meanwhile, stands at 324.5 percent when compared to the same metric.
